the program, which includes an original Capstone Production opportunity in the final semester. Looking ahead to the competitive demands of the performing arts industry, courses in career preparation, networking, audition techniques and creating original content help prepare students for an exciting transition into their professional life.

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Acting (Online) program offers a wide range of performance training for stage, film and television delivered through a digital environment. The intense eight-semester curriculum combines immersive, performance-based acting training with well-rounded and engaging academic studies. Students in the online program have many opportunities for digital performance

experiences, both inside and outside of the digital classroom. With an eye toward meeting the demands of today's entertainment industry, the upper semester curriculum includes in-depth career preparation, industry networking skills, audition techniques, original content creation and digital production courses to prepare graduates for an exciting transition into the professional performing arts industry.



Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Acting for Camera

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Acting for Camera program offers a wide range of training for film, television, stage and new media, with many opportunities for production and performance experience. The specially tailored curriculum includes essential training in scene study, acting for camera, improvisation, stage combat, screenwriting, film studies, and filmmaking and

production. As preparation for transitioning from student to professional performing artist, final courses include Industry and Networking, Sample Performance Reels, Audition Preparation and a Capstone Production blending live stage and filmed performances. The BFA Degree in Acting for Camera program helps prepare students to launch their careers as actors and artistic visionaries.



Associate of Occupational Studies Degree in Acting

The Associate of Occupational Studies Degree in Acting program prepares students to work in theatre, television and film. This immersive, four-semester program offers performancebased courses in acting, voice and movement to help actors develop a strong, connected physical presence while creating characters with rich, imaginative inner lives. Class work explores varied techniques and styles as applied for use on stage and screen, professional career preparation, voice production and speech, as well as specialized training in improvisation, stage combat and other movement-based skills, for creating three-dimensional, fully realized characters. As part of their program completion and career launch strategy, students perform in a special production experience in their final semester.

(Acting for Stage, Film and Television)

The Studio Conservatory
Certificate Program (Acting for
Stage, Film and Television) is a
rigorous four-semester practicedriven curriculum designed to
prepare students for careers as
working actors.

Students learn the essential concepts and techniques of effective movement, vocal control and character development.

Training begins with a focus

on the actor's imagination and an exploration of their inner resources as they relate to the external demands of the craft. Students are then quickly challenged to apply learned techniques — such as composing a visual and vocal score — to portray rich, believable characters. In the final semester, coursework is focused on industry and career preparation, including an original showcase production.

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Music Theatre program offers an essential blend of music, acting and dance training for aspiring Music Theatre artists. This immersive, performance-based degree program gives students the tools necessary for a career in contemporary music theatre performance blended with a range of academic studies, resulting in a well-rounded theatre arts education. Fundamental curriculum includes individual voice instruction, piano and sightsinging

to help establish a strong musical foundation. AMDA's clearly defined approach to vocal performance encourages a genuine union of music and lyrics that students then apply to a variety of musical genres. Companion courses in acting techniques, scene study, acting for the camera, music for the individual artist and voice production and speech help students forge the skills needed for creating transcendent performances on stage, screen and in the recording studio.

AMDA's clearly defined approach to vocal performance encourages a genuine union of music and lyrics that students can apply to a variety of genres such as classical, contemporary, jazz, blues, pop, etc. Fundamental curriculum for AMDA's online Music Theatre degree includes individual voice instruction, piano and sightsinging to help establish a strong musical foundation. Students learn professional rehearsal and performance principles

such as commitment, teamwork and collaboration within varied creative processes. Audition technique and career preparation courses help prepare students to work in the uniquely demanding and fulfilling performing arts industry. In their final semester, students perform in an original production crafted specifically for each cast.



Integrated Conservatory Certificate Program

(Acting, Musical Theatre and Dance)

The Integrated Conservatory
Certificate Program (Acting,
Musical Theatre and Dance)
provides comprehensive training
in vocal technique, acting and
theatrical dance performance. This
intensive four-semester program
develops skilled performing artists
prepared for work within musical
theatre performance. Students are
immersed in multiarts training from
the very start of their program.

A specified fixed curriculum helps develop strong foundations in a variety of musical styles, dance genres and acting techniques. Training begins with an emphasis on each individual artist's development, while subsequent courses provide opportunities to explore duets, trios and working in ensembles. Throughout the program, individual voice training helps support the breadth of courses provided each semester.





Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Dance Theatre

The Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Dance Theatre Program is a physically rigorous course of study that prepares pre-professional dancers for career opportunities in dance companies, on Broadway and throughout the film and television industries. A range of dance styles are explored, including Contemporary, Ballet, Modern, Jazz, Hip-Hop, Tap, Commercial Jazz and Broadway. By working with some of the

industry's most sought-after choreographers, dancers learn to blend precise technical choreography with interpretive storytelling, enhancing their ability to meet the demands of a competitive industry. Additional courses in acting, singing, kinetic storytelling and content creation cultivate skills that broaden students' casting and employment opportunities within the performing arts.

Associate of Occupational Studies Degree in Dance Theatre

The Associate of Occupational Studies Degree in Dance Theatre Program embraces interdisciplinary artistic development with an emphasis on communication and storytelling through kinetic expression. Coursework builds on classical foundations in Ballet, Jazz and Modern with explorations of contemporary, commercial and cultural styles such as Hip-Hop, Contemporary, Jazz/Funk, Broadway, Heels, Contemporary, Latin Fusion and others. Additional courses provide opportunities for practical applications of theory, choreography, acting and dance for the camera. Dance productions and other theatrical performance opportunities expose students to a wide range of choreographers and choreographic processes. Supplemental coursework in scene study and musical theatre contribute to this uniquely demanding program. As part of their program completion, students perform in an originally choreographed production.




Dance Theatre Conservatory Certificate Program






Bachelor of Fine Arts Degree in Performing Arts

Upper semester

coursework provides additional content creation courses exclusively dedicated to the student's specific area of performance focus. 


Bachelor of Arts Degree in Theatre Arts, Performance


Master of Arts Degree in Theatre

With opportunities to collaborate across the institution built into each program, graduate students work alongside other writers, scholars and performers to develop content that is relevant, contemporary and powerful.



High School Summer Conservatory

(On Campus and Online)

The High School Summer Conservatory program offers young artists intensive, college-level performing arts training on one of AMDA's dynamic campuses (New York City or Los Angeles). During this rigorous two-week program, students will be immersed in AMDA's performance-based training within their core focus. Taught by AMDA's elite faculty and notable graduates, AMDA's high school program aims to empower students through the fusion of

technical skill and imaginative storytelling. Core classes will be supplemented by an engaging and supportive rehearsal process that leads to an original production in one of AMDA's BlackBox stages. Students' learning will be enriched through social and cultural activities and events. In addition, all students will be given an opportunity to audition for AMDA's college-level programs or for a scholarship to return to one of AMDA's extension programs.





After School Conservatory (On Campus and Online)

The After School Conservatory at AMDA is designed for high school students seeking to expand on previous performing arts training or explore new performance mediums. Each session offers specialized courses related to a student's chosen discipline and that give personalized instruction to support students' growth. Classes are taught by AMDA's premier faculty and graduates and give students access to AMDA's performing arts educational resources. At the end of each session, performance work will be shared in a presentation. In addition, all students will be given the opportunity to audition for AMDA's college-level programs or for a scholarship to return to one of AMDA's extension programs.

Gap Programs

Designed with the idea that culture, diversity and passion are fuel for creative expression, AMDA Gap Programs take college-aged students through a transformative performing arts training experience, unparalleled in the US. AMDA offers the flexibility of an eight-week session in the summer or fall or a three-week session in the winter. Students are immersed in AMDA's performancebased training and enriched by meaningful exchanges with likeminded peers from all over the world. The AMDA Gap experience extends beyond the traditional classroom into New York City itself, where students will attend inspiring cultural and theatrical events. Students gain access to an international community of performing artists and the very best in performance education.



Performance Opportunities

An important component of AMDA training is the multiple and diverse performance opportunities offered to our students. The "curtain goes up" more than 150 times a year — from plays to musicals, dance concerts, showcases, workshops, readings, class presentations and student-created works.

Each semester, AMDA mounts professionally produced BFA productions in each of our three disciplines: acting, musical theatre and dance theatre. Recent shows have included Aida, Anna in the Tropics, The Lady from the Sea, Trifles, Big Love and The 25th Annual Putnam County Spelling Bee.

In addition to mainstage productions, AMDA produces short narrative films, curated selections of performed scenes, contemporary music concerts and screen-dance films.

AMDA's performance programs offer all students a showcase-style performance opportunity designed to provide students in their final semester of training an original, fully staged production experience. Each of these is crafted with the goal of showcasing some of the unique gifts and talents of each cast member. In addition to providing an opportunity to perform for friends, family and the AMDA community, this process helps students launch their journey toward entering the professional performing arts industry.

In addition to fostering committed, well-trained performers, AMDA supports and nurtures students who wish to explore and define their own artistic vision. Through various classes, workshops and performance platforms focused on original content creation, students have the opportunity to develop their own creative voices as writers, directors, choreographers, filmmakers and producers.

Performance on stage and screen is vital to AMDA's mission and is an integral part of our educational curriculum, artistic training and the overall AMDA experience.

It all starts with the audition.

AMDA's curriculum is challenging, diverse and career preparatory in nature. An audition is required for acceptance and admission to our programs to determine the best pathway for you. Whether you are a beginner or a more experienced applicant, our selection committee is looking for dedicated students who are committed to learning their craft and applying themselves as professional artists. You are encouraged to select audition pieces that showcase you and the type of creative you envision becoming. If

you would like assistance preparing for your audition, our Admissions team is here to guide and support you through the process. Each discipline has a unique set of audition requirements that can be found below. AMDA offers a robust calendar of auditions including:

National Auditions: Audition in a city near you.

On-Campus Auditions: Visit our campus and audition on the same day.

Live Virtual Auditions: Audition live from home with an AMDA faculty member via Zoom.



At each audition event, you will be engaging and working with a member of the AMDA faculty who will coach you through your audition to get the best performances possible. Understanding and taking direction is a major component to becoming a successful artist and you may be asked to make adjustments during your audition. This is our opportunity to better understand your ability and uncover your true potential. Above all, we want you to have fun! This is your moment to shine and show us what you want to share with the world. Enjoy it!

Program Audition Requirements

Acting/Acting on Camera/ Studio: Please prepare two contrasting monologues that

contrasting monologues that are each 60 to 90 seconds in length. These may be sourced from published plays or screenplays.

Musical Theatre/Integrated:

Please prepare 60 to 90 seconds (or 32 bars) of a song from the musical theatre repertoire and a 60 to 90 second monologue from a published play or screenplay.

Dance: Please prepare two contrasting dance solos (each solo approximately 60 seconds in length). Styles may include Ballet, Contemporary Ballet, Jazz, Modern, Tap, Ballroom, Hip-Hop, Theatre Dance, World Dance or Contemporary.

BA in Theatre Arts does not require an audition.


